

Uttrado Porto Rico

Jan 1st 1899.

I Francisco Casanueva Jeno of Uttrado Porto Rico hereby agree to lease to the United States for a period of twelve months with the option of a renewal for 12 months additional the following described property, to wit:

In the town of Uttrado Porto Rico lying in the rear of my residence and near the property of Casalas & Co one corral lot containing about $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres being the same property now used as a Corral yard for Animals at the Past of Uttrado Porto Rico

~~I further agree that the United States may have the privilege of pasturing its horses and mules on my farm of about acres lying in front of said corral and across the river from same - this pasture being the same used by horses and mules of the United States during the months of October, November and December 1898~~

I further agree that the United States may erect such buildings on said Corral lot

as it may require - said
buildings to be the exclusive
property of the United States
and I to have no claim
upon them whatsoever,
I have the legal right to
lease said property and
will defend said right
against all parties.

The consideration of the above
lease is that the United
States agrees to pay to me
the sum of \$37-50 - thirty
seven dollars and fifty cents
in US Currency - each month
during said lease - the
United States to have the
right to terminate this
lease at any time and
will only be liable to
me for the rental due
at the time the United
States terminates said lease.
