SUGGESTIONS.

HUYKE.-A lieutenant or vice-Governor to preside over the Senate and act as Governor during the absence, inability etc. of the Governor.

IGLESIAS.-That whenever the Senate rejects a nomination made by the Governor, the latter may have the privilege of sending the name back for a second time, in which case the Senate may reject it again by a two third vote, in which event the Governor can then appeal to the President whose decision will be final. It is also suggested that the appointments of both the Attorney General and the Commissioner of Education, if the above suggestion is accepted, be appointed by the Governor the same as all other heads of Departments.

Senator Iglesias calls attention to the convenience of having the law that prohibits a candidate to be on more than one electoral ticket, be abolished.

TORO.-Suggests the appointment of Mr. Gandia Cordova as an expert in his Department and have him act as Commissioner of Agriculture during his (Toro's) absence.

BONNER.-To have embodied in our organic act the general provision of all Territorial Acts prohibiting the Island from lending help, in the way of bonds, etc. to any public service corporation or private or public institution.

HARTZELL.-That the Public Service Commission should be composed of a few experts as Commissioners instead of so-many members as is today. The Commissioners to be appointed by the President.

TORO.-About the duplication of Bookkeeping and accounts in the Departments when all this could be well cared for in one office as that of the Auditor of Porto Rico.

HARTZELL.-That the Legislature should be prohibited from delegating to the municipalities the right to impose certain taxes, which is only a duplication of taxes already imposed by the Insular Government. Also the loaning of money to the municipalities by the Insular Govern-

ment should be curtailed, as well as the pledging the good faith of the People of Porto Rico for Municipal loans.

HUYKE.--That we get Porto Rico under the helping provisions of the Smith-Towner Act.

HARTZELL.--That efforts be made to have a Federal Farm Loan Bank established in Porto Rico.
