Post Commanders are appointed Inspectors of the respective divisions and will at once send out an officer, non-commissioned officer or intelligent private into each municipality to ascertain the extent of damage to houses and crops; the number of injured and sick and the number of destitute; the probable amount of food in the district and the points which demand immediate attention. These reports will be sent to these Headquarters at the earliest possible moment. It will also be the duty of the Inspectors to supervise the distribution of such goods and material as may be sent for distribution to the poor by the Board of Charities, or from other sources.
